Fire will damage all Waipu businesses

The buzzy little town of Waipu was a subdued place on Monday morning as residents and business owners alike looked in horror at the cordoned-off fire scene that just two days ago had been the popular Café Deli, the herbalist shop and the Waipu Pharmacy.

"The businesses here are all interdependent," said Hammer Hardware owner Coralie Roberts. She predicts the destruction of a block of three shops in central Waipu is likely to have a negative effect on all the Waipu businesses over the coming summer. Around 25 people (14 from the café alone) have no job to go to as a result of the fire.

Judy Guy, one of the owners of the café and herbalist shop buildings, said it would take some time for insurers to assess the damage and for the rubble to be cleared away. The presence of asbestos in the buildings was another complication and the local builders are already very busy.

Judy said, "We will rebuild as soon as we can but this is unlikely to be until some time next year."

Tony Solomon, who owned the pharmacy building, said he was waiting to hear what his insurer had to say. Despite being unwell, Brenda Wells, co-owner of the pharmacy business has been working overtime to set up a service for people who need prescriptions. Brenda said from Wednesday 3 October, Waipu Pharmacy will be temporarily processing prescriptions via Russell Pharmacy which she and her partner Jacqui Rogers also own. Prescriptions will be delivered directly to patients daily in the evenings until she can organize a designated pick up depot. Ruakaka Pharmacy has offered to help out but licensing restrictions prevent the Waipu pharmacists from working there.

Brenda said, "If you urgently require repeats or a new

prescription please call us to organize this or take it directly to Ruakaka Pharmacy. Our phone has been redirected, so you can still contact us on 09 432 0035. We will update you on a pick up point as soon as we have one organized. We thank the community for its continued support at this time. If you have any concerns please don't hesitate to call us."

The ATM money machine was also destroyed in the fire and Coralie has said the Hammer Hardware would provide cash as long as it has it available.

Ruakaka Fireman Ricky Timms said he got the call out at around 1.30am on Sunday morning.

"We could see the sky lit up with the fire from Ruaka-

ka and as we got closer we saw flashes of white so we knew the electricity was still connected."

Fire crews had to wait until Northpower turned this off before they could begin fighting the flames.

Ricky said they were concerned that the fire could jump across the road to the petrol station. The Hammer Hardware building was protected by a firewall but even so the fire crews sprayed this with water Deputy Waipu Fire Chief Trevor Vaile said the wall was so hot it hissed as the water hit it.

Ricky and the Ruakaka crew didn't leave the scene until at around 9.30am when relief crews arrived for the mop up.

EDITORIAL

Bream Bay might already be “The best place in the world to be a child.”

What a beautiful day! Not a cloud. This is Sunday 30 September I am talking about. The weather forecaster in my phone tells me by next Thursday when this edition of the Bream Bay News is due out, it will be raining again. But just for a few days and hopefully not too much water will fall from the sky. The beach was sparkling this morning. There was even one brave man out in the waves. I think after that long, cold wet winter the sunshine is finally winning. It's amazing how much difference this makes to everyone: birds and animals included. The Waipu Surf Lifesaving Club is celebrating ninety years of service this year. The club has come a long way since that first reel was fundraised for and purchased in 1928. Over all those years, I am sure there have been a few lives saved, hundreds of children have had fun and learned how to keep safe at the beach through the junior surf Nippers programme, many scores of young people have gained a sense of pride and purpose through their involvement in surf lifeguard training programmes and hundreds of thousands of volunteer hours have been expended. Everywhere I look around Bream Bay there are good things happening. In Takahiwai there is a Friends of the Berm group, which cleans rubbish and weeds from the roadside and has restored two thirty – year - old school bus shelters.

Last week this group invited children from One Tree Point Primary to paint colourful murals on their corrugated tin walls. On Friday, the last day of term three, Waipu Primary held its annual grandparents day. Children invited their nanas and poppas to the school and showed them examples of their work, gave them presents made in art classes and performed songs and a jump jam dance show for them. I couldn't stay at this wonderful event, however, because I had to rush down to One Tree Point Primary, which was holding a picnic afternoon to celebrate the completion of a beautiful new playground. The school's PTA has been fundraising to build this for the past 18 months. With support from local businesses and the school community the PTA exceeded its own expectations in the speed the \$85,000 price tag for the new equipment was raised. The playground is available for the community to use outside of school hours. Then there was the opening of the new Bream Bay College where last weekend. Having been shown through previously by a very proud school principal Wayne Buckland, I don't think I have ever seen more luxurious classroom space. At the same time as the new where opening was taking place a football tournament was being held at the Recreation Centre across the road, with teams from the 8th grade through to premiers taking part. Members of the Bream Bay United 15th Grade, who have trained as referees took charge of all the games.

At her speech to the United Nations, our Prime Minister told the world her government's ambition is to make New Zealand “the best place in the world to be a child.” Bream Bay might already be able to claim this status. My advice to those organizing the series of meetings with the stated purpose of making this a “Child Rich Community” is to start by making a list of all the advantages and opportunities children already enjoy here and to acknowledge the work of the many volunteers who provide these. If there are children who, for whatever reason are missing out, then with the enormous good will that exists here, I am sure we can find ways to help them participate in the life of our community.



Ruakaka Wastewater Plant urgently needs an upgrade

As independent monitor of the Ruakaka Waste Water Treatment Plant for the past eleven years, I have been calling for an upgrade of the wetland there since 2010 in response to Judge Newhook's Environmental Court recommendation given on 17 March 2008!

Judge Newhook recommended that once new dispersal fields were brought into operation, then the wetland there should be upgraded. However, nothing has happened, despite the fact that two fields, one adjoining Rama Road and the other opposite the plant have long come into use. All the district council has done is to increase capacity and, in so doing, has taken out quantities of reeds that are required as part of the treatment process. Reeds absorb nutrients and other pollutants found in human effluent.

As a result there has been a decline in the quality of part treated water discharged into the dunes. One should see the often bright green colour of the water! Not surprisingly there has been a rampant increase in the growth of weeds in the dispersal fields. Dunes normally support an environment low in nutrients but

not any more. .

No doubt the growth of a dense matt of mainly weeds in the dispersal field next to the wetland has contributed to ponding in breach of the resource consent. Sand dunes are normally free draining but not if they are obstructed by vegetation. I would be very surprised if any authority on wetlands had not noticed the problems that have developed at the plant. Surely he would advise an upgrade of the wetland to improve the quality of part treated wastewater at the very least. After all treatment of wastewater is part of the Whangarei District Council's core business. It should surely take precedence over a proposal to build a new headquarters and other non-essential activities. It is a public health risk.



It seems like a simple decision, choosing a pain medicine, but given the varying types of pain, from headaches to backache or joint pain, it is important to ensure you are getting the right medicine that suits you.

Best for your pain – Can you be sure that this is the best pain relief for you and your type of pain?

Exact dose – How much of this medicine should you take and how often?

Safe to take together – Are you taking other medicines that might have the same ingredients or don't work well together.

Upsetting you – How long can you take this medicine before it starts upsetting your stomach, liver or kidneys?

Risking your health – What health conditions do you have that may be made worse by this medicine?

Easiest to take – Is there another form that might be easier to swallow or may work faster?

What is Pain?

Pain is a highly unpleasant physical sensation caused by illness or injury. It is a major symptom in many medical conditions, and can significantly affect a person's quality of life.

The first step in treating pain is to find out the cause. You may be able to do this yourself, or you may need the help of your Pharmacist or Doctor. When you know the cause of your pain you may be able to remove it. If not, your Pharmacist or Doctor can suggest the best treatment for you.

Chronic Pain

Chronic pain is long-term pain that carries on well beyond the expected time of healing. Chronic pain does not generally relate to an injury. People with chronic pain often need medicines other than simple pain-relief. They can have difficulty sleeping, and have other symptoms such as tiredness, lack of energy, difficulty staying motivated, and depression.

Ask your Pharmacist for advice on lifestyle modifications (relaxation techniques, exercises to keep fit) and reassurance. Often your Doctor, Physiotherapist or massage therapist need to be involved in treatment.

How can I relieve my Pain faster?

If you need pain relief fast, use liquid capsules or dissolvable tablets. Some medicines are available in faster dissolving formulations.

Pain relief for your child

Ask your Pharmacist for a Paracetamol and Ibuprofen Dosage Guide to ensure you are aware of safe dosages in children.

Pregnancy and breastfeeding

Paracetamol is usually considered the pain reliever of choice for pregnant and breastfeeding women, but first check with your Pharmacist before taking any pain relievers.

When to see your Doctor

If your pain becomes worse or lasts more than 2-3 days (more than 24 hours if it is a young child).

Ruakaka Recreation Centre building doesn't qualify for Regional Growth Fund

The Ruakaka Recreation Centre committee has been informed that its planned multi generational building does not meet the requirements for the Regional Growth fund as it would not generate jobs.

The project also did not make it onto the Whangarei District Council's Long term Plan.

Christine Thirling said this is all very disappointing however she will be turning her attention in the immediate future to applying for funding to build an extension to the Men's Shed at the back of the recreation centre building. She said the space in the existing shed is now too small for all the activity that is going on inside.

A number of projects have been announced for funding by the Coalition Governments \$3 billion over three years Regional Growth Fund. So far, the only money to come in our direction is part of a \$500,000 fund for the development of a Northland Rail Upgrade business case, which as part of its brief will consider the railway spur from Oakleigh to Northport.

An undisclosed amount (in confidence because of commercial sensitivity) has been set aside to look at moving the location of Ports of Auckland, giving Northport "serious consideration."

There is also \$6,200,000 for the development of a Northland Twin Coast Discovery Route with a lot of this earmarked for improvements to State Highway One at Kawakawa which is subject to flooding but at the end a reference to the development of an "overarching cycle trail plan for Northland."

Opp shop reimbursed

A man called into the Waipu Opportunity Shop and handed over \$150 for the disposal of the old furniture and household goods that were left outside the shop a fortnight ago.

The Opportunity Shop, which donates all its proceeds to local charities, frequently has to meet the cost of disposal of unsaleable goods left outside the shop outside its operating hours. In this case, however, someone has taken responsibility for this expense.

Brightening up the Takahiwai school bus shelters

Groups of children came in relays from One Tree Point School on Monday 23 September to paint brightly coloured murals onto two bus shelters on Pirihi and Takahiwai roads. The shelters were donated thirty or more years ago by the New Zealand Refining Company and have recently been repaired and tidied up by Takahiwai's Friends of the Berm volunteers. The mural outlines were painted in black lines onto the shelter walls by artist Dr. Benjamin Pitman, who first visited the school to discuss ideas for the concept with the children.

Even Councillor Phil Halse was shocked



Damaged duneland north of the Waipu Estuary

Even Councillor Phil Halse, who usually has no time for "greenies", was shocked when he saw photographs of the damage to the northern edge of the Waipu wildlife reserve caused by motorbikes in the dunes and four wheel drive vehicles right up to the edge of the estuary.

He suggested the Waipu Residents and Ratepayers Association should propose putting a line of big rocks across the beach to shock the authorities to do something about the problem.

David Lourie, who spends a lot of time and effort

trying to look after the northern side of the estuary, gave a presentation at the Annual General Meeting of the Waipu Residents and Ratepayers Association on Wednesday 26 September.

He said the Waipu Wildlife Refuge was designated in 1961.

It is a breeding place for New Zealand Dotterel, variable oystercatcher and potentially for the New Zealand fairy tern. White fronted tern, Caspian tern, shags and shore skinks live there.

There are also native dune plant species: pingao, spinifex, meuhlenbeckia, coastal coprosma and the jointed wire rush oioi all grow there yet the place is being thrashed.

David fences off the shorebird nesting sites and puts up hand made signs telling people that they should not be driving in the dunes or taking dogs or vehicles into the wildlife refuge. The signs and fences are repeatedly pulled out and smashed up.

Signs at the Tip Rd vehicle entrance to the beach also advise drivers not to take their vehicles into the dunes or into the refuge. These also have been vandalized.

David showed a YouTube clip taken on a Gopro by

Police Report

Judge rules release on bail could pose a danger to Odyssey house neighbours

Hayden Hall of Ruakaka appeared before Judge Greg Davis in the Whangarei District Court on Friday morning 28 September for sentencing on 10 burglary charges that he had previously pleaded guilty to.

His counsel told the judge that he had been granted a place at Odyssey House to deal with his methamphetamine and alcohol addictions and asked that he be granted bail for this purpose.

However, this was opposed by the Police prosecutor, who said that he failed to see the connection between drug and alcohol addiction and the kinds of crimes Mr. Hall had committed.

The prosecutor said Mr. Hall had broken into the homes of women who were his neighbours, whom he knew and he was aware lived alone. He had written messages on the walls and staged effigies in the burgled homes, the only purpose of which could have been to terrify the female victims.

Mr. Hall had told Police he had made the effigies to make the Police think that the burglaries had been

committed by children but the Police prosecutor said, if anything, this just aggravated his crimes.

Judge Davis said that "given the nature of the offences" he was unwilling to release Mr. Hall on bail to the rehabilitation centre.

"There would be no measure of compulsion. If he is given a general bail he can walk tomorrow and the occupants of the house next door to Odyssey House are under threat."

He said he would be prepared to consider an "ebail" although the Police have indicated they would be opposing this as well.

Mr. Halls lawyer said she was waiting on a report from Odyssey House on whether he could be admitted under electronic monitoring.

Mr. Hall's next appearance in court will be via audiovisual link (AVL) and is set down for 8 October at 2.45pm.

Hayden Hall has been in prison on remand since his arrest in March 2018.

Quick arrests after armed robbery at the Kaiwaka superette

On 18 September at 2pm the Four Square Superette in Kaiwaka was robbed at gunpoint. Two hours later the escape vehicle was located on State Highway One just North of Kaiwaka. Police stopped the car in Gorge Rd. and the three occupants, aged from 16 year to 19 years were arrested and charged with: aggravated robbery, unlawful taking a motor vehicle, fire arms charges and thefts from other retail outlets.

Fireplace stolen from construction site

Overnight on 26 September a fireplace was stolen from a building under construction In Stace Hopper Drive, One Tree Point.

Five family harm incidents

In the period from 14 September to 29 September, Police attended five family harm incidents

Multiple charges result from search warrant

Police executed a search warrant at a Marsden Village address on 24 September and, as a result, arrested a 24-year-old far north man. He has been charged with three burglaries, four thefts from shops and service stations and unlawfully taking a motor vehicle. These offences occurred in Ruakaka and Whangarei. The young man has been remanded in custody and will appear in the Whangarei District court on 1 October for a bail hearing.

On 23 September at 12.30pm Police clocked a motorcycle travelling at 152 kilometres per hour on One Tree Point Rd. A 30-year-old One Tree Point man will be appearing in the Whangarei District Court charged with excessive speed



Mair bank closure



Marsden Bank and Mair Bank - the area of the temporary closure is marked in pink.

In June this year, the Ministry of Primary Industries (MPI) announced a temporary closure for collecting shellfish from Marsden Bank and Mair Bank. The closure came into effect 28 June.

MPI has updated signs on boat ramps and beach access points, and fishery officers working in the area have been talking to boaties and beachgoers about the closure. Fishery officer patrols have stepped up in the Marsden Point area, both on the water and on land.

Before the closure, there was a ban on gathering pipi from Mair Bank after concerns were raised by local hapū Patuharakeke in 2014 about overharvesting. The number of pipi had fallen from an estimated 10,000 tonnes in 2005, to less than 100 tonnes in 2014.

In response to further concerns about the overharvesting of mussels, Patuharakeke lodged a proposal with MPI in 2017 asking to close Marsden Bank and Mair Bank to the gathering of all shellfish. In just one season, the mussels off Mair Bank were almost completely exhausted so action needed to be taken to help this fishery rebuild.

Later in the year, MPI ran public consultation on the closure proposal. Of the 13 submissions received, 12 were in support.

The main objective for the closure is to help regenerate shellfish on both Marsden and Mair Bank, to improve future availability of shellfish for customary and recreational fishers. It also recognised the customary practice of Patuharakeke in exercising kaitiakitanga over all species of shellfish on the Bank.

“Patuharakeke Te Iwi Trust is working on a Communication Strategy to be prepared in conjunction with the community: i.e. local schools, industry, community groups and other interested parties, to provide further clarity and understanding about the rāhui and to identify the extent of the closure area and the full range of the mahinga mātaitai (traditional fishing ground) and species it relates to.

A spokesperson for the trust said, “Further updates from Patuharakeke will follow in the near future”.

a motorbike rider as he travels through the dunes between Tip Road and the Waipu estuary. The clip showed a moon like landscape commonly referred to as the bowl by riders, where the vegetation has been killed off and the sand from the former dune with no cover to protect it has blown away

David said the Department of Conservation does not seem to have the resources to enforce a bylaw banning vehicles from the dunes.


People who live in the vicinity of this stretch of dune-land say that over the weekend the whine of bikes coming from this direction is constant. The majority of the bike riders seem to be from outside Bream Bay who has heard this is a good place for off road motorbike riding.

Councillor Halse said that Auckland City is growing

by 40,000 people a year and we are only an hour and a half away and Auckland’s growth is having an impact here. He said the various authorities: the Whangarei District Council, The Police, the Department of Conservation and the Northland Regional Council should be working together to solve this problem.

“It is our responsibility to preserve this area and the wildlife in it for future generations.”

He suggested the Waipu Residents and Ratepayers Association should threaten to take drastic action such as building a rock groyne across the beach, to spur the various authorities into action.

An excerpt from the diaries of the Reverend William Levack who was Waipu's Presbyterian Minister from 1952 - 1964



The Reverend William Levack

ANZAC DAY 1963

April 1963 Thu 25 – This ANZAC Day was about three days long. I was up at 4am and dressed in the dark and away in Athol McLean's car. First stop was at the Waipu RSA clubrooms for a whisky. Can you believe it? But the sun was certainly under the yardarm at 4:30am. The hens in the wayside poultry farm were up in a blaze of electric light laying their first eggs. In Whangarei we found the war memorial deserted and wait in the car. It was cold and I was shivering and it was dark, and so I decided not to waste any more time over medals or robes, and at 6am the men arrived marching from the club rooms. There were 500 of them, and I was surprised to see so many out. There was a loudspeaker and a wireless microphone. The band played a hymn tune but nobody sang. I read "David and Jonathon" and a short prayer out of a book. Peter Brown read a fancy bit

which is traditional at the dawn services, and they turned a light on the memorial. We half sang "God Save the Queen" and it was finished. It was still dark and I was still shivering. Off to the Whangarei club rooms for coffee laced with rum and by 7am some of these characters were incapable already. Fancy at 7am! I had some talk with the RSA president and McDowell of the wireless station, and George Hodson, the children's old teacher, and was introduced to Johnson, the mayor of Whangarei who did not utter a word, also Lovell the county chairman. Home by 8am for breakfast. The Waipu Anzac service at 11am was more crowded than I have ever seen it, and old Lang read the usual lessons. Mrs Robson played the organ, Chris Gordon rang the bell and there were no hitches. After the service, forming up outside, the RSM in charge, Bert Worthy, as usual, let the school children have a blast of disciplinary language, and told them to shut up and stand still. This caused great amusement to the grown-ups, but blank astonishment of the children who were, of course, not accustomed to be addressed in that tone of voice nowadays. After a sleep we went all three to view the bar, and being low tide, were deceived into being cut off by the tide on an island, as both mouths of the river were now in full function and we were between them, on the incoming tide. I had to wade well over my gumboots to get back. Quite a day.



The 90th anniversary of the Waipu Surf Life Saving Club



Ian Godfrey has written a history of the Waipu Surf Life Saving Club.

The Waipu Cove Surf Life Saving Club is celebrating its 90 anniversary this month and, to mark the occasion, Ian Godfrey, Lifeguard, Life Member and past President has written a history of the club.

Waipu Cove became a very popular seaside resort in the 1920s, with Edwin McMillan's beach store and guesthouse doing a roaring trade. With the increasing popularity of the beach, it became evident that something had to be done to provide a regular beach guard for swimmers in the surf.

Mr. McMillan suggested to family and friends in 1928, that a surf club be formed and life saving equipment provided. He called a meeting of interested men in his hall and it was agreed that the club should be started and a life saving reel purchased. This established

Waipu as the first formal Surf Life Saving Club in what is now known as the Northern Region and the northern most club in New Zealand at that time.

On the day the reel arrived it was installed on the beach and lifesaving drill began. On the next Sunday it was brought before a large crowd on the beach and demonstration given. Then, the hat went round and the first contribution were made towards payment of the reel; they did this twice on that first Sunday and from then on every time there was a crowd on the beach until, at last, the equipment was paid for.

Today the club is an integral part of the Waipu community, participating each year in the Waipu Christmas Parade and providing summertime activities for local children and young people. It runs a volunteer surf lifesaving service at Waipu Cove over each weekend of summer from Labour weekend and for around six weeks over the busiest weeks of the season paid lifeguards are on duty at the club from Monday through to Friday.

Equipment used on each patrol includes: inflatable rescue boats, life jackets and helmets, rescue boards, rescue tubes, radios and first aid equipment including a defibrillator.

Volunteers also run a junior surf programme with *Nippers* 4-12-year-olds, *Rookie* training for 13-year olds and Surf lifeguard training for 14 - plus- year - olds.

The 90 year celebrations will run from 27 - 29 October with wine and nibbles at the club from 6pm to 9pm on Friday 26, a birthday cake, shared around for morning tea, club demonstrations and opportunities "have a go" with some of the gear opportunities on Saturday 27 from 10am - 12 noon, a treasure hunt taking visitors to points of interest around Waipu from 12 noon, and from 6pm, a celebration dinner which has been sold out. On Sunday 28 October some of Waipu's sports clubs will be offering activities to people visiting for the celebrations


