Ocean outfall for disposal of treated wastewater a likely outcome of rapid growth in Ruakākā and One Tree Point areas

An ocean outfall to dispose of treated wastewater is a likely outcome of rapid residential growth in Ruakākā and One Tree Point.

The Whangārei District Council's Long Term Plan discussion document states:

"We are working with hapū partners on an integrated response to potential growth in Ruakākā, which includes a new wastewater treatment plant and disposal system and stormwater catchment management. The rate of growth in the area means that this investment is needed sooner than previously thought.

The Council already has a consent for the ocean outfall with one of the conditions that this will only be built when all land based disposal options have been exhausted.

Upgrading Ruakākā wastewater treatment and disposal is flagged as one of the big-ticket items of capital expenditure the 2024 -2034 plan. Between 2024 and 2030 the Council has budgeted a total of \$84.8 million for these projects.

EDITORIAL

Happiness for children and their families at the Waipu **Easter Carnival**

Two subjects are top of mind for me this week - one joyful and full of colour the second dark and foreboding.

To start in the happy place - the Waipu Easter Carnival was wonderful. I wandered round looking for bright little faces to photograph on the pony cart, the Merry Go Round, the tractor rideand the dodgem cars. I spoke to many parents, aunts and uncles and grandparents and I was struck by how much all these children are loved and how proud their families are of them. There were children from Waipu, Ruakākā, Kamo, Onerahi and Auckland. Some of the families were expensively dressed and some were barefoot, long haired and tattooed. All these parents and grandparents had brought the children to the fair so they could have a happy time together. Grandparents sat in the sun and watched their grandsons perform dare devil feats on the bouncy castles, mothers leaned over the guide ropes with their phones to photograph the smiles on the faces of their little sons and daughter in the pony cart and aunties took joy in the happiness of little girls as they had their hair plated with coloured ribbons and painted with glitter.

To cross to the dark side - I have been reading through submissions on the Vaco Developments Waipu Gateway project and thinking about how complex this application is. Submitters are putting forward arguments that I had not thought of before. The New Zealand Transport Agency, for example, has a concern that stormwater from the new car park and roads into and around the proposed commercial site will overwhelm the swales on the edge of State Highway One flooding and compromising the road north.

The Coalition Government's Fast Track Approvals Bill will give three ministers: Shane Jones, Simeon Brown and Chris Bishop sweeping powers to approve developments. I just don't believe these three, none of whom appear to have a good understanding of environmental matters are capable of making wise decisions on our behalf.

Development for developments sake is not always a good thing. Lots can go wrong. We just need to look around. Cutting down all the kauri forest on those steep hillsides early last century was not a good idea. It led to erosion, flash flooding downstream on the flats and siltation of rivers and streams.

Clearing the totara forest from the sandy back dunes of Bream Bay didn't work out either. Grass didn't grow there very well. Sand, with no covering vegetation, blew everywhere and then weeds took over. Pampas, wild ginger, climbing asparagus, tobacco weed, you name it - it's growing there.

A spectacular example of a development idea that didn't work out is the Marsden oil fueled power stations dreamed up by the late Sir Robert Muldoon, which cost so much, took so much effort and toil and came to nothing when conditions changed and the price of oil went up.

The Marsden Cove Development bisected a beach so the developer could build canals inland for the purpose of creating ever more high priced water front sections.

The Marsden City developer had a plan for a new city with mega stores, schools, a railway station and even a university. Thousands of cubic metres of peat soil were dug up, carted away and stockpiled at our local quarries or spread over farm land. The site , previously a productive farm, sat vacant for over a decade, letters fell off the sign and the stormwater pipes corroded in the acid soils and had to be replaced at great expense. Marilym

Deferred in the draft Long Term Plan

Two areas of work deferred in the Whangārei District Council's 2024 – 2034 Long Term Plan that might be of concern to Bream Bay residents are:

There will be no new road sealing apart from roads the Council has already committed to sealing. McLean Rd. in Waipu, which was due for sealing this summer when funds needed to be diverted to road repairs after Cyclone Gabrielle is on this list.
There is no funding allocated in the ten year plan for walking and cycle trails which might draw some submissions from Waipu residents keen to see the final two and a half kilometres of the Waipu to Waipu Cove Cycle and Walkway completed as well as the many Ruakākā and One Tree Point cyclists who desperately need a safe route between Marsden Cove and the Ruakākā Towncentre.

Funds for new cemetery

The sum of S970,000 has been allocated in the WDC's Parks budget for development of the Ruakaka Cemetery. This money will be spent over the years 2024 - 2031

Drop in session on the WDC 10 year plan

The Whangārei District Council's Long Term Plan is proposing a general rates rise of 17.2%. The draft plan consultation document says this larger than usual rise is necessary because the Council's income is not keeping up with its expenditure, costs are escalating, there is a large repair bill as a result Cyclone Gabrielle and the Government is placing increasing demands on local councils without helping with additional funding.

This is not the highest rate rise of any Council in NZ this year. The Hamilton City Council is asking for a 19.9% rise and the Buller District Council for a massive 31% rise. Its higher than most though. The Auckland Council is proposing a 7.5% rates increase. A News Hub report in mid March found the average proposed Council rate rise was 15%.

The rates increase is on the flat rate charged on the land value of each property and not on any targeted rates such as water rates. Water rates however are due to go up by 20% for the 2026/2027 and 2027/2028 financial years, in large part, to help pay for the upgrade of the Ruakākā wastewater treatment and disposal systems. A graph in the LTP consultation document shows that the current Whangārei District rates are below the national average.

Council staff will be present at a drop in session at the Ruakākā Recreation Centre (Takutai Place, Ruakākā.

Another 270 metres of the Waipu to Waipu Cove Cycle and Walkway

Another 270 metres of the Waipu to Waipu Cove cycle trail is under construction. The new section moves the crossing from the McLean Rd intersection to a safer spot further along Cove Rd.

The work is being carried out by Paul Cowpland at a discounted rate

Trust Chairman Tim Manning said Paul has done a great job on the new section and the many cycle and walkway users will be grateful.

Traffic control was provided free of charge by Waka Kotahi and Fulton Hogan who agreed that the Traffic Control staff stationed at the McLean Rd./ Cove Rd. corner while Cove Rd. was part of the Brynderwyn bypass route options could take care of traffic safety for the cycleway construction as well

Paul Jenkins is providing cartage and Mountfield Quarry is supplying the metal.

While the trust has funding in hand to build this section, further money will be required to finish the cycleway to the cemetery so the fundraising efforts continue. Donations can be made through the Waipu Cycle and Walkway website.

The Whangārei District Council had undertaken to build the section between the cemetery and Riverside Place to complete the trail. However, the Council currently has many competing demands and in fact in its draft long Term Plan the Council proposes to defer all its cycling and walking projects. It will take a demonstration of strong public support for this project in Long Term Plan submissions to keep it on the agenda.

Meridian lodges consent applications for Ruakākā Solar Farm

Meridian Energy has lodged resource consent applications with the Northland Regional and Whangārei District Councils to build and operate a 200-hectare solar energy farm at Ruakākā.

The solar farm would be stretched across three sites alongside Rama Rd. and Marsden Point next to the under construction BESS Battery storage plant, opposite the Ruakākā Towncentre – bordering Marsden Point Rd. and along Port Marsden Highway, opposite the Marsden Town Centre development.

The application to the NRC seeks permission for earthworks, vegetation clearance, and stormwater diversion during the earthworks, and discharge of stormwater to land during earthworks. It seeks land use consents from the Whangārei District Council. The three s sites are currently zoned as: Heavy Industrial, Light Industrial, and Rural Production.

Around 200,000 photovoltaic solar panels would be spread over the three sites. The solar farm would generate 150-200GWh of electricity) per year and would be capable of providing over half of Northland's average annual energy consumption. The solar energy would be conveyed to the (currently under construction) Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) on the corner of SH15 and Rama Road via several inverter stations and a 33kV connection prior to injection into the grid.

The full application can be viewed on the NRC and WDC websites.Submissions are open until Tuesday 23 April 2024

Tsunami siren testing next Sunday 7 April

Northland's six-monthly tsunami siren test will take place at the end of daylight saving on Sunday,7 April.

The network of more than 200 outdoor tsunami sirens in Northland coastal communities, is checked twice a year, coinciding with the start and finish of daylight saving.

The sirens sound twice: firstly at 10am for 10 minutes and then again at 10.30am for 30 seconds, and will be monitored for any faults.

Northland Civil Defence Emergency Management Group spokesperson Zach Woods said . "Everyone who spends time on the coast needs to know the natural warning signs of tsunami - a strong earthquake that is hard to stand up in or one that lasts longer than a minute, or out-of-the ordinary sea behaviour, such as sudden rise or fall and/or unusual noise."

He said Northlanders can check out whether they live, work or play in a tsunami evacuation zone, and plan the quickest route to safety, using the interactive maps at: www.nrc.govt.nz/evacuationzones

Northland's outdoor tsunami sirens are funded and owned by the region's three district councils (Far North, Whangarei and Kaipara) and operated in a partnership which also includes the two electricity networks Northpower and Top Energy.

New sirens, which will cover a wider area, have multi tone siren sounds and in addition, give a pre programmed voice warning are currently being installed. They will be independent of the power grid and installed on their own poles. The first of these new sirens will be installed in Whangārei this year but to avoid confusion won't be used until all the old sirens have been replaced.

Three days of hearings set down for Vaco Developments Waipu Gateway Service Centre proposal

An independent hearing panel of two has been appointed and a date set for the hearing on the Vaco Investments Waipu Project Ltd. application for resource consents to the Northland Regional Council and the Whangārei District Council to build a service and commercial centre at the intersection of Millbrook Rd. and State Highway One.

The hearing commissioners are: David Hill (Chair) and Dr. Lee Beattie.

The hearing is set down for Monday 22 April 2044 through to Wednesday 24 April at the Whangarei District Council, 9 Rust Avenue commencing at 9am on each day.

The Whangārei District Council received 52 submissions, 43 of these in opposition and nine in support to the Waipu Gateway Service Centre when submissions closed on 5 February.

Another fuel service station application

There is currently a resource consent application before the Whangārei District Council for and unmanned fuel stop facility at 4 Mountfield Rd. alongside State Highway One just opposite the entrance to the Department of Conservation's Uretiti campground

The application is by Vishal Arora of NZ Venture Properties Ltd.

The new facility would include a light vehicle fuel service station, electric vehicle charging, truch refueling and truck parking. No food or dring retail outlets are proposed in this application.

Submissions are due with the WDC by 11.59pm on Tuesday 16 April.

NZTA opposes Waipu Gateway development

The New Zealand Transport Agency NZTA submission on the Vaco Development Waipu Project for a service centre and commercial development at 47 Millbrook Rd. requests that the application be declined.

The agency has questioned the applicants assessment of peak traffic volumes It has concerns about the proposed roundabout on the state highway to give access to the development as this would be less than 500 metres (the desired standard between intersections) from the Braigh/SH1 intersection. The roundabout would also reduce the length of a passing lane on the highway.

Another concern is that the development's stormwater flows appear to discharge directily into the roadside swale which raises concerns about the depth of water in the swales exceeding recommended levels and posing a risk to vehicle safety.

The NZTA submission says "The applicant should undertake a detailed hydrological assessment to evaluate the impact of development flows on State Highway infrastructure and safety.

Vaco's engineer has responded saying, "We understand that it was the NZTA's original suggestion in May 2022 that "a roundabout south of Millbrook Road – The Braigh intersection is the best option and should be investigated."

This suggested site for a roundabout was opposed by Waipu Residents and Ratepayers Association and Promote Waipu in favour of a roundabout at Nova Scotia Rd. as it would deflect traffic through the centre of Waipu Township. Vaco Development's engineer Frances Deamer Phillips of CKL has replied that stormwater ponds would be provided to attenuate the flow of stormwater into the swales "as per the existing scenario"

While the proposed development raises the site significantly, swales around the site are provided to

convey upstream flow to the existing roadside swale along SH1, to replicate the current situation.

Keeping the bypass roads open



Des Ashton, foreman, and Te Whata James work for Traffic Management NZ and are part of the crew stationed at the McLean Rd. / Cove R.d intersection making sure no trucks too big to get around the hairpin bends on the road between Langs Beach and Mangawhai get past.

In the aftermath of Cyclone Gabrielle when State Highway One over the Brynderwyns was closed truck and trailer units frequently go stuck on that section of road with some requiring a crane to lift them free. As a result traffic on this remaining route into Northland got help up for hours,

This time The New Zealand Transport Agency is taking no chances with check points and traffic management crews at every intersection and bridge, six stop points in total, between between Waipu and Mangawhai. While the highway over the Brynderwyns is closed the check points are in place 24 hours, seven days a week.

The crews have been instructed to flag through empty log trucks with trailers loaded onto the truck tray but to stop truck and trailer units and big 12 wheel mega freight carriers. Mr. James said while the traffic management crew stopped three in the first few weeks the truck drivers have become aware of the situation and are no longer attempting to get through.

As well as the two Traffic Management staff there was a security guard present at the McLean Rd stop point last week in case drivers who get turned around get aggressive.

Police Report

Police investigating Ruakākā fires

Police are investigating a number of recent fires in the Ruak $\bar{a}k\bar{a}$ area, some of which they believe have been deliberately lit.

There have been two significant recent fires near the old Marsden Power Station which caused a large amount of damage to vegetation.

Sergeant Matt Nicholas said, "With the dry conditions we are currently experiencing this has made a perfect environment for these types of fires to flourish and

More crashes on Brynderwyn by pass routes

There has continued to be a number of vehicle crashes on the alternate pass routes while State Highway One over the Brynderwyns was closed to traffic.

• On 22 March a vehicle crashed on the one lane bridge leading into Waipu. The driver misjudged the side barrier leading up to the bridge and damaged his left front wheel. He was issued with an infringement notice.

On 17 March a vehicle failed to take a left hand bend at the top of the hill descending into Langs Beach. The vehicle slid on loose metal then hit a power pole before coming to a halt across a driveway. No one was injured.

Ten family harm incidents

Bream Bay Police have also been kept busy with a large number of family harm incidents.

Over the fortnight Saturday 16 March to Saturday 30 March they dealt 10 incidents, eight in Ruakaka and one each in Maungaturoto and Waipu.

Police are concerned with the danger this poses to the nearby communities.

"We believe there will be someone out there with information or will know or suspect someone who is responsible.

On 16 March–A vehicle located down bank on Waipu Gorge Road. The side of the road gave way and the Ute slid down a bank. There were no injuries. On 21 March there was a two-vehicle collision on Waipu Gorge Rd. The two cars hit each other side to side on the narrow road.

Three mental health crises call outs

Over the same period they were called out to three mental health crises events; two in Ruak $\bar{a}k\bar{a}$ and one in Waipu.

Co-operative action by Waipu retailers leads to arrest of repeat shop lifter

Some co-operative action by Waipu retailers has led to the arrest of a shoplifter who has targeted the Waipu Liquor Store the Four Square and the Waipu Pharmacy.

Lovepreet Singh, manager of the Four Square, said a woman had shoplifted from the store for the third time on Thursday morning when she walked out the front door without paying for a shopping bag full of groceries. On earlier occasions she had walked out with a loaded red bucket trolley.

The woman's image was captured on the store's security camera and, while staff were aware of her shoplifting history, they were very busy on Thursday morning just prior to Easter so she was able to fill her shopping bag. However once she was outside the storeowners

managed block her exit from the parking space outside with their own vehicles and called the Police.

The same woman had also stolen from the Waipu Pharmacy taking around \$300 worth of goods on two occasions and from the Waipu Liquor Store from where she stole two bottles of spirits and a box of RTDs on two separate occasions.

Last Tuesday the retailers learned that the woman was staying at the Uretiti campground and had alerted the Police. She was visited there and charged with the various thefts but despite this was back in Waipu shoplifting again on Thursday

After Easter reprieve highway over Brynderwyns is closed for another five weeks Photos supplied by NZTA

Pictures speak louder than words about the massive road recovery work underway on State Highway One over the Brynderwyn Hill. Over 520 staff are working day and night on the project, excavating, hydroseeding, installing retaining walls and cutting over 127,000 m3 of soil.

When the work is completed, traffic lanes will be moved closer to the hill and a shoulder created allowing more room to clear slips and debris, minimising the need for lengthy, major closures in future adverse weather events.

After six days with the road open to give some reprieve to Northland businesses over Easter it was closed again at 12:01am on Wednesday 3 April and will remain closed until 11:59pm on Sunday 12 May to complete the remaining work that can't be undertaken alongside traffic. Recovery work that can be done with the road open is expected to continue for the rest of 2024.

Over the next five weeks while the highway remains closed the three detour routes will remain available, including SH12/SH14, Paparoa Oakleigh Road and Cove Road.

Steve Mutton, Director of Regional Relationships with the New Zealand Transport Agency said contractor teams will continue to "proactively inspecting the routes every day to address any issues and ensure that the roads are as high quality as possible including clear signage and way finding."
