### Keen weed busters needed to take advantage of Northland Regional Council pest control funding

The recently adopted Northland Regional Council Long Term Plan has allocated some significant funding to the control of animal and plant pests in the Mangawhai and Waipu areas.

Under the plan Waipu and Mangawhai are described as "high value pest control areas" and have been jointly allocated \$166,640 per year for three years for this purpose.

Asked if the weed control portion of this funding would be confined to the important biodiversity area in and around the Brynderwyn hills, Bruce Howse, the Northland Regional Council's General Manager of Environmental Services, said this would depend on the community's priorities. He was hoping to meet with Waipu and Mangawhai groups throughout July to find out what these are.

Councillor Rick Stolwerk, who represents the NRC's Coastal Southern Constituency, said the funding would be allocated through community organisations and if there are no local groups willing to do this work then the money won't be spent.

To this end Graeme Giles, who already belongs to the Waipu trapping group, is hoping to form a Weed Action Waipu team. He has called a meeting to be held in the Waipu Boat Club at 7pm on Wednesday 25 July and hopes people "keen to see the Waipu area cleaned up a bit" will come along.

Graeme envisages the group could function along the lines of a Whangarei Heads Weed Action Group, which maintains a website inviting people in that community to "take action to stop invasive weeds from taking over the incredibly beautiful environment we all love. To join the fight in your own backyard and in the bush to protect what is uniquely ours."

The Whangarei Heads group appoints a weed of the month – this month it is "the putrid tree privet which it says is "right up there in our dirty dozen priority target." It also provides a community weed bin and invites local residents to "bring in your invasive weeds and we will get rid of them free of charge."

### **EDITORIAL**

# The Ruakaka and Waipu resident and ratepayer associations could morph into Community Boards with paid members

I didn't watch the Bream Bay College winning entry in this year's stage show competition, so I suppose I can't really criticise but I feel a bit uneasy about children as young as 12 or 13 being involved in developing a stage show on the complex subject of suicide. Two years ago, when Bream Bay won the Stage Challenge competition the theme was rape. I wish they would find some happier subject.

I believe the school Principal Wayne Buckland stepped in to stop the students performing a styalised suicide on stage. For once I agree with you Mr. Buckland.

Stage Challenge and, I presume its new incantation, is student driven. Teachers are not supposed to have any influence.

I wonder about the wisdom of this. We have rich cultures to impart to our children. We shouldn't step away from our responsibility in handing these on. The tutors of any good school kapahaka group don't stand back and let the kids do their own thing.

What's wrong with a good Shakespearian play? I know young people like to deal with dramatic themes and, come to think of it, there is murder and bloodshed, love, death, depression and suicide a plenty in Shakespeare.

"Tomorrow, and tomorrow, and tomorrow, Creeps in this petty pace from day to day, To the last syllable of recorded time; And all our yesterdays have lighted fools The way to dusty death."

But there is also poetry and poetry is important. Learn

a bit of poetry off by heart and it will come into your mind when you need it. Think about how those lines were written 400 years ago and understand your current misery is not unique. There is complexity, a layering of the ridiculous, the tragic and the beautiful. Just like life.

Over 121 Community Boards or local boards operate throughout NZ but there are none in the Whangarei District.

"Community Boards are important for all New Zealanders because they make local government more accessible and help to raise ratepayer awareness of services issues and events," Mark Lester, Chairman of Community Boards New Zealand's executive committee as quoted on this organisation's website.

When public submission time comes around next month on the WDC's current Representation Review, I will be asking for two community boards for Bream Bay.

The Waipu and Ruakaka resident and ratepayer associations could easily morph into community boards with paid members. The greater influence board status gives along with the remuneration would likely result in more local public interest in their activities.

Also from the Community Boards New Zealand website

Community boards:

- Represent and act as an advocate for the interests of their communities,
- Report on and consider any matter referred to them by their council,
- Make annual submission to their council on expenditure in their area,
- Maintain an overview of services provided by council within their community
- Communicate with organisations and special interest groups in their community.
- Carry out any other responsibilities delegated by Council.

It all sounds a bit like what our two resident and ratepayer groups do already.


### Dancing to the music of the Whangarei Basin City Big Band

# First rural plan change proposal makes it over the line. Nine more in the pipeline

On 5 July the first of the Whangarei District Council's rural plan change proposals becomes operative. It's taken a long time. The first round of discussions on these changes took place in 2015.

A hearing panel of three chaired by Greg Hill and including John Williamson and Bill Smith spent months considering over 600 submissions on these changes last year and released its report to Council in November.

Plan Change 86B which takes effect today is relatively uncomplicated, rezoning land on the outskirts of Whangarei from countryside to residential.

To quote from the WDC website this is to allow for projected population growth in the Whangarei District.

This is the only one of 10 proposed rural plan changes to have made it over the line so far.

The Whangarei District Council voted late last year to accept some substantial changes proposed by the Hearings Committee on the other nine and these changes are now going through a public appeal process of their own

Perhaps the most significant change from the original Rural Plan Change package is to refocus what was to be called a Rural Productive Environment to recognize that rural production is not the sole function of these areas and that much of the land included is not productive, that a significant number of people live and work in this environment (often on small blocks) and that it also has areas of significant ecological value. The panel suggested (and the WDC has agreed) that the name of this zone be changed to Rural Countryside Environment to reflect this wider focus.

Of interest to Bream Bay lifestyle blockers some additional areas will be re-zoned as Rural Living where the commissioners have been persuaded by submitters that these meet the criteria for this zone.

Rural Living Environments in Bream Bay now in-

clude: two blocks along Mountfield Rd, one between State Highway One and Doctors Hill Rd. and the other in the valley between Applecross Rd. towards the Shoemaker Rd. intersection.

On Prescott Rd. from State Highway One and a large area along Cove Rd and up Cullen Rd.

The Rural Living Zone allows for subdivision to an average lot size of 2 hectares. In effect this means that a property owner with a 10 acre or 4 hectare block can subdivide off a 2,000sq metre section.

Brooks Rd and Massey Rd. life style block dwellers asked for a rural living zone but don't seem to have been able to persuade the commissioners of the merits of their cases. Perhaps they can take some comfort though in the wider focus Rural Countryside Environment that will recognize their existence alongside productive farms and areas of ecological value.

Set backs from metal roads in Rural Countryside Zones have been reduced from 100 metres to 30 metres which will come as a relief to the owners of at least one Massey Rd. block who found under the former 100 metre rule there was nowhere on their block suitable to build their dreamed of home.

Industrial and commercial activities in the RCE (and other zones) will be provided for as discretionary as opposed to non –complying so long as these are appropriate and support rural productive activities, rural communities are recreation and tourism-based activities and are of an appropriate size.

Buildings in RCE zone will be permitted up to 2000m2 (with standards) to better provide for rural productions activities.

Minor dwellings will be permitted in the RCE but their subdivision will remain as a prohibited activity. Environment Benefit Lot subdivisions will be reintroduced where mainly indigenous bush and wetlands can be protected in subdivision off a parent block.

# Census information won't be available in time for WDC representation review

The Whangarei District Council is forced by legislation to undertake a review of its representational structure before information from the 2018 census has been made available.

It is clear to anyone living in Bream Bay that this area has experienced rapid population growth in the past five or six years but with 2018 census figures unlikely to be announced before late this year or early in 2019, the full extent of this growth won't be recognized when the Council sets its new ward boundaries.

Because of a relatively low response to the 2018 census, (information was received on 90% of individuals living in New Zealand as opposed to 94.5% in the 2013 census) Statistics NZ is having to cross reference information with that received from other government departments to gain an accurate picture. Statistics NZ media advisor James Weir said no date has been given yet for the release of 2018 census data but this is unlikely to occur until late 2018 or early 2019.

Kathyrn Candy, a senior legal advisor for the Whangarei District Council, explained, "As Council is bound by the Local Electoral Act 2001 to undertake a representation review every 6 years, we must undertake this review in 2018 (last review was in 2012). That statute also stipulates a timetable that must be adhered to so that the decision on the representation review is made well before the local body elections in 2019. Therefore Council must make its initial decision on representation arrangements by 31 August 2018. Due to these timeframes we are unable to use the 2018 census data. Instead we use the 2017 population statistics from Statistics New Zealand.

She said that the Local Electoral Act also allows the Council to undertake a representation review again in time years' time if it feels that things have changed enough to warrant another full review.

The Local Government Commission requires that there is a reasonable ratio of elected members per head of population and that communities of interest are represented effectively.

The Bream Bay Ward gets to elect two councilors. Councillors Phil Halse and Shelley Deeming are long time holders of these seats.

The ward currently has a few anomalies when it comes to the *communities of interest* criteria. It covers the southern part of the Whangarei District: Langs Beach, Waipu, Ruakaka, One Tree Point, Maungakaramea and Portland but also includes a densely residential area on southern edge of Whangarei city, bordering State Highway One and Tauroa St. and stretches across State

Highway 14 into Maungatapere. Presumably these boundaries allow the Bream Bay Ward to retain its two councilors under the proportionality of councilors to population requirement. If the census shows the big population jumps we have all perceived in Ruakaka, One Tree Point and Waipu perhaps these boundaries could be adjusted to reflect our "community of interest' more accurately.

Alongside the legislated requirements, there are some arrangements regarding our local government representation that Councillors do get to determine.

The WDC is currently asking itself and electors a string of questions such as:

- Is the current 13 councillors plus the mayor the right number?
- Do the current wards accurately reflect communities of interest?
- Should the Council introduce community boards? It doesn't have any at present.
- Should the Council retain its six ward structure?
- Could we just elect councilors at large over the whole district instead or have a mixture of at large and ward elections?
- Are the current six wards: Bream Bay, Whangarei Heads, Hikurangi-Coastal, Mangakahia-Maungatapere, Okara and Denby named correctly? Councillors have been holding a series of workshops on this review and have completed what it calls

pre-consultation with members of the public invited to fill out a questionnaire on the subject.

Council workshops will continue through July with an initial proposal planned for public notification on 1 August followed by a public submission period throughout August.


On 27 September the council will come up with a final proposal and this will be publically notified on 3 October with an objection period to follow until 2 November.

### **Police Report**



### Two fatal road accidents in a single week

It's been a busy fortnight for Bream Bay Police with multiple traffic accidents including two fatalities.

- On Wednesday 20 June at 9am a north-bound four-wheel-drive vehicle appears to have crossed the centre line on State Highway One at Waipu near the Shoemaker Rd. intersection, colliding with an articulated New World truck. A 53-year-old man, the driver of the 4wd, died at the scene.
- At midday on Saturday 23 June a 71-year-old woman died in a single vehicle accident when her car left Whakapirau Rd, colliding with a tree.

### Multiple traffic accident

- On 14 June a utility vehicle loaded with firewood was stolen from Glenmohr Rd. in Waipu. However while driving away the thief crashed the ute into the side of the single lane bridge on Glenmohr Rd. He (or she) fled the scene, but not before setting alight to the Ute, which was burnt out. Police are investigating.
- On 20 June at 4.30pm there was a collision between a light truck and a log truck at the intersection of State Highway One and Nova Scotia Rd. Miraculously no one was hurt.
- On 20 June at 3pm, a woman pulled over to answer her cell phone at the intersection of State Highway One and Doctors Hill Rd. and hit a large rock hidden in the grass.
- On 24 June at 2am a vehicle struck the centre barrier on State Highway One over the Brynderwyns. No one was hurt.
- On 25 June at 3pm there was a nose to tail crash at the intersection of Peter Snell and Marsden Point Roads. No one was hurt.
- There were three more minor crashes in the Maungaturoto area over this period.

### **Drink Driving offences**

- A 30-year-old local woman will be making an appearance in the Whangarei District Court after she was stopped while driving on Peter Snell Rd. at 7.30pm on 15 June. Her breath alcohol reading was 518 micrograms of alcohol per litre of breath. The legal limit for people over the age of 20 years is 250 mcg.
- A 26-year-old old Whangaparoa man was stopped by Police while he was driving on State Highway One at 1am on 17 June. He was found to have a breath alcohol level of 903 mcg of alcohol per litre of breath and will be appearing in the Whangarei District Court on a drink driving charge.
- A 43-year-old local woman was stopped while driving on Marsden Point Rd. at 10.30pm on 22 June and recorded a breath alcohol level of 288 mcg of alcohol per litre of breath. She has been prosecuted for this offence.

### Fence posts stolen

Thirty-six fence posts, ready to be installed in a fence on Marsden Bay Drive, were stolen some time between 18 and 22 June. The thief would have needed a truck or large trailer to remove the posts.

### Tyre slashing at Mair Rd. carpark

On 23 June at around midday, a vehicle parked in the Mair Rd car park had its tyres slashed.

# WDC will attempt to sort our flooding problem in Roger Hall Memorial Park

Floodwaters from the Roger Hall Memorial Park came alarmingly close to the Bream Bay Community Trust building in Takutai Place during the deluge from 21-23 June.

Sue Rudman, the trust's manager said the water was about four metres away from the back door and an equal distance from the new children's playground alongside Peter Snell Rd.

Sue said she has reported this problem to the Ruakaka Recreation Centre, which is the trust's landlord, and the Whangarei District

Council in the past and is pleased that this time the council has responded.

WDC parks manager Sue Hodge said she would be sending someone out in the next few days to see if a sump can be installed at the lowest point in the field. Floodwaters also rose underneath the classroom

building alongside the trust and have remained there with nowhere to drain. A puddle of water also appeared on the floor of the classroom. Sue is unsure if this came from the floodwater below or through the walls or ceiling and has engaged a builder to inspect the building for leaks.

### Brake line cut by would - be fuel thief

A farm manager of a property in Topuni had the brake line cut on his diesel vehicle while he was away for a few days between 13 and 19 June.

Back from his break he got into the vehicle and was heading down the driveway onto State Highway One when he noticed he had no brakes. He managed to pull up using his hand brake and climbed underneath to see what the problem was.

"All the lines had been cut. It was lucky I didn't get out on the highway. This is a pretty dangerous stretch of road. There is a southbound passing lane here and traffic travels by at quite a speed." "I don't have any enemies. I think this was just an opportunist crime. Someone must have run out of diesel. A lot of people run out of fuel or get punctures or something on the road here and I help them out when I can. I don't want anything to do with idiots like this though."

The vehicle still had a full tank of diesel so, if the farm manager (who wanted to remain anonymous) is correct, about the motive and his brake line was cut by would be fuel thieves they didn't manage to get what they wanted.

This year the Bream Bay students tackled the difficult theme of suicide, seeking input from mental health professionals before they began work on the choreography.

An online final will find a Showquest national winner

in September.

Art in Motion, the organisation started by former Bream Bay College student Jayden Rudolph announced in May that it had merged with Showquest to hold the Whangarei competition. Jayden, along with a friend Teale Vint, had determined to hold their own Stage Challenge replacement when they learned in January the organisers of the competition were pulling out for financial reasons.

Showquest is an offshoot of Rockquest Promotions, which runs the annual Smoke Free Rock Quest secondary school competition.

# Jayden Rudolph - The teenager directing Waipu's big show

It's not everyday that a teenager is given the opportunity to direct Waipu's biggest show, but Jayden Rudolph isn't your everyday teenager.

Stepping into the role of co-director for this year's Art'n'Tartan show, nineteen year old Jayden is excited to bring something new to the annual event; 'no-one has ever seen anything like this in Waipu' he claims enthusiastically.

With much past-involvement in Art'n'Tartan, as well as various other forays into the performing arts, co-directing this year's show seems a natural progression for Jayden. Growing up in Bream Bay,

Jayden has been involved in performance and dance since primary school. Joining Bream Bay Ballet and Pulse dance studio in Ruakaka further inspired Jayden, 'that's when I got really obsessed with performing arts and decided to do it as my career.' In the year that followed Jayden led Bream Bay College to victory in Northland's Stage Challenge, a student led competition that was instrumental to Jayden's development on and off the stage, 'I don't think I would be the person that I am today without Stage Challenge - it really helped develop my choreographic, directing, and leadership skills.' Jayden went on to study performing arts at Otago University but decided to leave because he felt creatively limited, 'I don't think I was really challenged enough with my dancing or with my ideas - there was a specific format of how to do things.'

Now with a free-rein to pick and choose creative projects, Jayden is making the most of it. As well as teaching at the Pulse and Ballet studios where he was a student not so long ago, Jayden conceived and developed a replacement for Stage Challenge called 'Art In Motion' (AIM), 'where we could create a better and newer opportunity for students'. For Jayden it was the first time in a management role, 'It was all very new to me, I'm always performing on the stage, I'm never backstage so it was really different being that person - it was really exciting.' Held on the 20th of June, the night was a grand success, topped off with Jayden's former high-school Bream Bay College taking first place, 'It was just nice that they continued the legacy on' laughs Jayden.

Most importantly, returning to live in Bream Bay allowed Jayden to continue his collaboration with Art'n'Tartan. Having worked alongside director Helen Francis last year as choreographer, Jayden gained valuable experience with the show's inner-workings, 'If I didn't have that opportunity with Helen I wouldn't be doing all these amazing things this year, so I'm super grateful for that experience.'

Now the executive-producer, Helen is confident in Jayden's ability; 'I felt that to keep the show fresh and invigorated it needed new creative input. Jayden has proven that he delivers, he totally understands wearable art and what it's about.' Working alongside Jayden and also making her directorial debut is Annie Newall, 'We are really on the same wavelength when it comes to creativity' says Jayden, 'I create these massive ideas and she fine-tunes them, she's the realist of the two - I think that's what you need as a collaborative pair, you need that balance.' Taking place on the 20th and 21st of July at the Celtic Barn, Jayden says the show will be 'entirely different', 'I want everyone to walk in and immediately see something different.' When asked about his future beyond this year's Art'n'Tartan Jayden is a unsure, 'I really have no clue what direction I'm going in at the moment - once Art'n'Tartan's over I'll have some time to think'. Having said that, he already has performance plans for the summer, so watch the space!

# A seventy-five lot retirement village under construction in Ruakaka

A new retirement village is under construction in Ruakaka with the first of 75 two-bedroom, two bathroom villas expected to be ready for occupation in October. The new village is being built on what was previously the Port Marsden Industrial Park.

After more than a decade the park managed to attract just two businesses: The Full Noise panel beating workshop and a commercial gymnasium. When Full Noise moved into larger premises alongside, the old workshop became a warehouse.

Now with the tide of retirees, selling up to release equity in their highly priced Auckland homes and moving north, Paul Gray the owner of the park has teamed up with Cliff Cook, described in a press release as a "successful retirement entrepreneur" to build what is to be known as Bream Bay Village.



In a supplied press release the show is described as "a black comedy that entertains and enlightens those who have been directly or indirectly affected by depression and loss with an uplifting message: there is a way out of the dark."

Rob Mokaraka is an award winning actor and playwright but back in 2009 he was in the news for another reason.

Suffering from depression after the collapse of a relationship he called the Police and told them an armed man had broken into his Pt. Chevalier home.

He gave the Police a description of himself and dressed in camouflage pants, an air force trench coat . He held a soup ladle wrapped in a tea towel in one hand and a meat cleaver in the other and went outside to meet the waiting armed police officers.


He was attempting what he describes as *Suicide* by *Cop*. He was warned by Police not to take a step towards them and when he did an officer fired. He was dropped by a single bullet to the chest but survived.

He wrote *Shot Bro* as part of his recovery. He says it was tricky to find a narrative that was safe for him to perform and for the audience to hear.




