Passions run high over Museum expansion plans

Ken Couper, the Chairman of the Waipu Museum is in the hot seat as passions run high over the future of the museum.

"If the object was to gain lots of different opinions then I think we can say the consultation went pretty well", said Ken of two information sessions held in the Celtic Barn on Saturday 27 and Sunday 28 October.

More than 130 people turned up to the sessions which museum manager Fiona Moir considered "an excellent turn out."

Architect Grant Harris of HB Architecture explained two different concept plans he had prepared for the museum expansion.

The first to extend the current building both at the front and the rear to incorporate more display and work space and to give street frontage to the museum shop and a possible museum café.

The second concept plan involves leaving the current building as is and purchasing of the soon to be vacated Waipu Hammer Hardware building, which would be redesigned with glazing along its northern wall to form a link into the Caledonian Park.

Ken explained to the Bream Bay News that the museum board had started off with five options:

• To do nothing,

• To extend to the north into the precinct where a number of historical buildings have been collected,

• To extend the museum out the back only

EDITORIAL Visitors from around the world walking along our beach

It's Te Araroa season when hikers with packs on their backs and walking poles can be seen heading southwards along the beach or up Cullen Rd.

There are an estimated 1500 people making the journey this year, most of them starting from Cape Reinga in October, November or early December and taking around three weeks to reach Bream Bay.

A fortnight ago I joined my husband Geoff on the trail for two days, walking from Pataua South to McLeods Bay around the Taiharuru estuary, up Kauri Mountain, along Ocean Beach and over Bream Head. It wasn't easy. At the end of day one I was exhausted enough to sleep soundly on my thin foam rubber bed roll.

There is something wonderfully liberating about the self-reliance of hiking. Everything we needed: food, fuel, cooker, water, sleeping bag, and tent, warm clothing was in our backpacks. Modern technology helps a lot of course. Maps, GPS location information, elevation readings, weather forecasts, advice about the best camp sites, photo and video cameras, books to read, information to help us identify birds and plants we come across and the ability to let friends and family know we are still alive all contained in our 212 gram cell phones.

Geoff is using his phone for regular Facebook updates and has gathered quite a following. People seem to enjoy watching someone else sloshing through mud, falling face flat in a river or plodding up numerous steep hillsides.

Since then we have had a succession of Te Araroa walkers come and stay at our home for a night. They vary widely in age, nationality, occupation and personality. One of Geoff's trail buddies is Steve,

> a 72-year-old Canadian economist. Another is Sebastian, а 22-yearold from Sweden who works in a supermarket. Alex, a lovely young American TA walker, said she was glad Geoff and Sebastian had found one another as they share an obsession for research into hiking equipment and will discuss the merits or demerits of a particular brand of sleeping bag for hours on end. A kiwi family: a mum,

dad and two children aged nine and six, is making the journey. When I heard about this I thought the parents must be crazy. How could anyone expect a six-yearold to walk 3,000 kilometres? I met this group on the summit of Mt Lion and they seem to be making good progress. The two children are not carrying anything but the parents have quite large backpacks. I believe there is a tepee style tent they all sleep under in the dad's pack. As they paused to talk to us in a sunlit clearing the mum handed the two kids a bottle of water to drink from and the dad pulled hats over both the children's heads. What an adventure they are on!

Geoff is back on the trail now but it's been fun. TA walkers, who have been living on noodles and dehydrated food for three weeks are very appreciative people to cook for. They all took photographs of the breakfasts I made them with tomatoes, avocados, asparagus bacon and free-range eggs.

Let's welcome these travellers as they pass through our district. If you see one in Waipu or Ruakaka ask about where they are from and how the journey has been so far. Give them some friendly local advice. If you have the time and enjoy meeting new people invite them home for a meal. We could build a reputation amongst Te Araroa hikers as the most welcoming place in New Zealand.

There's a lot of excitement about the economic benefit the SailGP boats being tested on Bream Bay will bring in the shoulder season, just before the busy summer, for our local hospitality industry and, hopefully, this is happening. However, I think these TA walkers, must be bringing an equal amount of value. What is more, the benefits from these visitors are likely to be spread more evenly around our community. They stay at local camping grounds and homestays; they restock their supplies at our stores, buy takeaways and call in to our cafés. For the most part, they are interesting, selfreliant individuals and it is enjoyable to meet and talk to them. So let's make the most of these months when we have these adventurers from all around the world walking alongour beach and through our towns...



Waipu Pharmacy replacement building arrives in the early hours

It was an early start for Louise and Paul Wickham of The Centre Waipu Ltd. on Monday morning 29 October when they were on hand to see the arrival of the relocated house the company has purchased for the Waipu Pharmacy. Electricity lines needed to be disconnected for the operation and traffic was diverted away from the main street as the house carrier gingerly backed the trailer with the house on board through a narrow gap between the Magic Tasty Takeaway and the building housing the hairdresser and osteopath.

The Centre Waipu Ltd., with directors Louise and Paul as well as Angela and Rick Stolwerk have worked with some urgency to get a building on site to meet stringent Ministry of Health security requirements for pharmacies. Since the fire in the main street of the town early on Sunday morning 30 October, Brenda Wells, the Waipu pharmacist, has been travelling on a daily basis to Russell to make up prescriptions and then delivering them around Waipu in the evenings.

Louise said it is hoped the pharmacy will be able to open in its new premises by the end of this month and that this is possible because the various companies involved in the relocation and in setting up the new building have given priority to the project.

Meanwhile it has been all go in the new Waipu café deli building. Jo Spring the business owner had hoped to re-open in the little cottage over the road from the burnt out building on Friday 2 November but had a hold up with the electricity connection. She told the Bream Bay News on Monday the café would be re-opening in one form or another the following day. She said Councillor Phil Halse had been "just amazing" in helping to negotiate the way through the various Whangarei District Council regulations and local tradesmen had been very supportive, negotiating time off from current jobs to fit out the new café space.


Will the Waipu ATM be replaced?

Asked whether the ATM destroyed in the Waipu fire of 30 September would be replaced, Emma Mellow a media contact person for ANZ replied, "We're working with local businesses to find a new site, however, for a new ATM to be installed it must meet our accessibility, safety and security requirements. We apologise for any inconvenience while we explore options for the Waipu community."

Asked if the cash in the ATM had been destoryed in the fire Ms Mellow said it had been and where possible it had been counted and sent back to the Reserve Bank to be destroyed.

The new purpose built educare centre in Ruakaka will be liscensed to cater for 85 children. The current centre, alongside the Ruakaka Recreation Centre, is liscensed for 50 and is running at capacity.

Alan Lints, Educare director said, " Our aim is to cater for current Bream Bay families as well as newcomers to the area. We are well staffed in preparation for the opening with staff and tamariki "overseeing" the project from across the road.

"Guyco (the company building the new centre) is on track to be finished in January. We aim to be licensed and ready to relocate at the end of January".

More dust problems for Sea Dune Place residents

When strong gusts of wind on Thursday 1 November sent clouds of black dust over the properties in Sea Dune Place and Dune Lake Place from John Keith's 80-lot subdivision alongside, residents contacted the Northland Regional Council.

NRC compliance officer Colin Dall said Mr. Keith had explained he has a water truck, which was at another of his projects last Thursday but would return to the Tamure Rd. subdivision when work resumed there.

The residents say the dust has coated their houses and gardens and infiltrated their homes and is causing some of them health problems.

Last summer they also experienced dust problems from the subdivision, sometimes unable to open windows on the southern side of their houses for months on end during the hottest months.

Infringement notices for people who dump rubbish in Te One St. pine forest

The Whangarei District Council will be serving infringement notices on two people whose mail was discovered amongst piles of rubbish dumped in the pine forest behind Te One Place, Ruakaka.

Rubbish dumping in this forest is a frequent occurrence and expensive for the caretakers of this Treaty Settlement land to deal with.

The latest two trailer loads of refuse included: plastic bottles, old carpet, tyres, broken glass and parts from wrecked vehicles.

The broken glass, in particular, presented a hazard for local people who walk and exercise their dogs in the forest.

Grant Alsop, the Whangarei District Council's Waste and Drainage field officer said even though the land the rubbish was dumped on does not belong to the Council, he could still issue infringement notices for rubbishing dumping there.

Who wants to be a volunteer freedom camping ambassador?

The Whangarei District Council has come up with a plan to have volunteer ambassadors at each of the district's ten most popular freedom camping spots with Ruakaka beach being first on the list.

Whangarei Mayor Sheryl Mai said, "The rise in freedom camper numbers has brought increased social and economic benefit to the district, but also pressure on existing infrastructure and growing numbers of Susan.Halliwell@wdc. complaints from resident.".

training, ongoing Council support throughout the Programme operating period of 20 December 2018 to 10 February 2019, and a koha for expenses.

Understanding Allergies

What are Allergy symptoms?

The symptoms of an allergic reaction depend on the type and severity of the reaction.

Common symptoms include:

- sneezing
- · watery and/or swollen eyes
- stuffy or runny nose
- itching
- a rash or hives (raised red itchy areas on the skin)
 stomach common
- + stomach cramps

A fast pulse and nausea and/or vomiting are less common reactions.

How are Allergies treated?

The best management for allergies is to avoid the allergen, however this is not always possible. For mild symptoms your Pharmacist is able to recommend treatment options including antihistamines, decongestants or corticosteroid nasal sprays.

Antihistamines – these are available as liquids, tablets or nasal sprays. These prevent histamine release and relieve sneezing, itching and help dry up a runny nose.

Decongestant nasal sprays and tablets - these

unblock the nose and relieve nasal congestion. They should only be used occasionally and never for more than 3 days at a time.

An allergy is when your body's immune system reacts to normally charmless substances that it sees as harmful. The allergy-causing substances are called allergens.

What causes Allergies?

Many substances can cause an allergic reaction, but some of the most common are:

- pollen
- mould
- animal hair
 dust and dust mites
- dust and dust mites
 latex
- latex
 medicines
- insect stings
- foods

Are there different kinds of Allergic reactions?

Different allergens will cause different kinds of allergic reactions. The most common allergic conditions are hayfever, asthma and skin problems (e.g. eczema, rashes, hives).

- Airborne allergens such as mould, dust, pollen,
- grasses and weeds can cause hayfever.
 Pollens, moulds and house dust mites can trigger asthma attacks.
- Skin reactions can be caused by contact with an allergen (like latex or certain metals), by insect bites or stings, or by eating food or taking medicine you are allergic to.
- Common foods that may cause allergies are shellfish, eggs and nuts.

What is Anaphylaxis?

Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction, often affecting several parts of the body.

- trouble breathing, including wheezing
- swelling of the lips or tongue
 pale, cool, damp skin

Symptoms typically occur within 30 minutes of exposure, often within five minutes, and usually develop rapidly.

The Waipu Museum

To get away from Ken described as "small town personality clashes" the museum board engaged the consultant Sally Manuireva. She eliminated three of the options but said she needed to do more investigation of the two remaining and to this end, held the weekend public consultation exercise.

Asked about what would happen next, Ken said the board would be waiting the consultant's recommendation.

"Sally will be taking the feedback on board. This in one of the last steps in the process before she can report back."

At the Sunday information session when a member of the audience asked if there could be more time for people to get their feedback in. Ken had replied that this would be left up to Ms. Manuireva.

"No disrespect to Sally but it is costing us quite a lot for her services so I think we should leave her to do the job."

Asked by the Bream Bay News how much the consultation fee is Ken said he felt this was personal information to Ms. Minuireva.

"I find her to be very professional and I support the work she has done."

He said he wouldn't employ a farm consultant and then ignore the advice.

Comments made at Sunday's consultation session included:

• The current stone building was built by an earlier generation of descendants of the Nova Scotian migration to house their memories and treasures. Their efforts should be respected and the collection should remain in this building.

• A glass shop front (Option One) would detract from the attractive appearance of the stone building.

• The collection should not be secondary to the shop and café.

• There was talk of the Waipu Museum becoming a gateway to Northland museum, which didn't sit well with some. Would the enlarged museum space mean the museum would need to tell "other people's histories?"

• Why not develop the museum to the North, making use of the buildings and land behind and the work volunteers have done on the collection of historic buildings there. Why isn't this option included?

Museum Chairman Ken Couper assured those at the Sunday afternoon gathering that the status of the Waipu Nova Scotian migration would not disappear under his watch.He said the Nova Scotian story is central to the identity of Waipu and would remain so.

The museum currently receives generous funding from the Whangarei District Council but this may not always be the case and if possible it would like to become more self sufficient - hence the need to give the museum shop some street frontage and the proposal for a café. Ken told the Bream Bay News there is opposition from some to inclusion of the story of pre European Maori inhabitation of Waipu in the museum but he feels that this content will serve to enrich the Nova Scotian story. "Ideally we will end up with three exhibition spaces, one for the Nova Scotian collection, one for the Maori collection and a third for changing exhibitions, which will bring local people back to the museum."

He said, while it needs to look after its Nova Scotian collection for the descendants of the migration, the museum also needs to consider Waipu's present day community, which it depends on for support for its various activities such as the Pageant and the Art n Tartan wearable art show.

Ken said a room to host visiting school children which could also be used as a community room would be useful and more space and better IT equipment for museum volunteers, staff and genealogists to work in is needed.

He said he was aware that it would be impossible to please everyone.

"I suspect that no-one will get exactly what they want and we are all going to have to compromise."



Police Report

Constable Martin Geddes beach safety project, which has volunteers patrolling Bream Bay over summer to make sure people are safe on the beach and in the water has gained national recognition as one of six finalists at the Problem Oriented Policing Awards held in Wellington last month.

Sergeant Simon Craig Officer in Command at the Bream Bay Police Station said for Constable Geddes project to be named as a finalist was "very impressive' as it relied on one police officer, Bream Bay surf lifesaving clubs and a group of around six volunteers.

By contrast the winning entry an initiative to improve the relationship between Police and the Tuhoe people involved 300 police officers, (more than the whole police force of Northland) and including senior ranked police as well as Tuhoe leaders.

Constable Geddes started the beach safety patrol after witnessing the distress of family and friends when a young Chinese man drowned at Uretiti on Christmas Day 2014.

More building site burglaries

There have been three more reported burglaries from building sites in the Marsden Cove / One Tree Point area.

• On 18 October batteries from machinery were stolen from a site on Stace Hopper Drive.

• Overnight on 19 - 20 October plasterers tools were taken from another building site.

• And some time between 20 - 24 October house fitting were stolen from a building site at One Tree Point.

Sergeant Simon Craig encourages people to phone 111 if they see any suspicious activity or to contact the Bream Bay Police Station with any relevant information. Phone 432 7719 and ask to speak to Sergeant Craig. All calls go through to a call centre but the operator will divert the call to Sergeant Craig's cellphone if he on duty or leave him a message, which he will reply to if he is not.

Crashes

Over the three weeks from Friday 12 October to Friday 2 November Bream Bay Police attended a total of 13 vehicle accidents, in two of which people died.

On 20 October at around 4pm a van and a car collided on State Highway One at Mata. A 65-year-old Auckland woman and a 42-year-old woman from the UK, both of whom were passengers in each of the vehicles died.

On 24 October at around 10am there was a head on crash between two cars at Kaiwaka. The driver of one of the vehicles was not wearing a seat belt and died as a result. The other driver had his seat belt on and escaped with no major injuries.

Drink driving offences

• On 19 October a 45-year-old Ruakaka woman was stopped while driving on Marsden Point Rd. Her breath test showed a level of 931 micrograms of alcohol per litre of breath. The legal limit is 250 micrograms.

• On 15 October a 29-year-old Waipu woman returned a breath alcohol level of 586 mcgs of alcohol per litre of breath.

Both these women will be appearing in the Whangarei District Court on drink driving charges.







Villy Day Out shaping up as fun event



Helen's Head Shave

Fifteen years ago Waipu's Helen McGregor lost her life after a three year battle with breast cancer. This year Helen's daughters and friends are holding a head shave to commemorate her life and to help other women and families affected by breast cancer. All money raised will be donated to the NZ Breast Cancer Foundation and hair to the Locks of Love charity.

McGregor was diagnosed in 1999 when youngest daughter Sian was just a baby, but doctors delayed her mastectomy for three months. By this time the tumour had grown from the size of a marble to the size of a golf ball and had also spread to her lymph nodes. When she finally had the operation, she contracted a flesh-eating disease that resulted in more breast having to be removed. She also endured several rounds of chemotherapy over the three years until she passed in June 2003, the day before her 37th birthday.

Many people in the community were affected by her death due to her involvement in the Bream Bay area. She owned the Bream Bay News, which she had to sell upon becoming sick. The bagpiping community was also impacted by her passing, and now honour her with the Helen McGregor Memorial trophy for which pipers from around the world compete annually in Waipu on New Year's Eve. At the time of her passing, her three daughters were aged; 14, 11, and 4, with two of them enrolled at the local high school. They also attended highland dancing, and ballet groups in the area.


