Woman left sitting on Police Station steps with her belongings in plastic bags

A mentally unwell 58 year-old woman was left sitting on the steps of the Bream Bay Police station with her belongings in plastic bags after Police uplifted her from her son's Ruakaka house on Sunday afternoon 21 January.

A local woman was driving past the station with her daughter when they saw the woman being taunted by local children who were throwing rubbish at her.

"I knew those kids so I stopped the car and got out to speak to them.

I said how would you like it if this was your grandmother," the local woman said.

She then asked the woman why she was seated there. Other people had also stopped and some had phoned Sue Rudman of the Bream Bay Community Support Trust but Sue told them she was unable to help until Monday.

So the local Good Samaritan invited the woman home to her own house and arranged for a loan from one of her daughters to purchase a bus ticket so she could return to Hawkes Bay where other

EDITORIAL

Lack of an adequate mental health crises service puts pressure on Police

The subject of mental health has been in my thoughts a lot this week. The story of the woman left with all her belongings on the front steps of the Ruakaka Police Station sparked this off and where ever I go and who ever I talk to the evidence just piles up – there is a mental health crises here in Bream Bay as there is throughout the whole country.

There was a photograph of a young man who had gone missing in Whangarei on the cover of the Northern Advocate last Saturday (3 February). There are fears for his safety because of his state of mind. The young man looked so hurt and lost in the photograph. My heart went out to him. I hope he is found safe and well. I hope he can find a way to recovery.

There are many cases like this. I hear lots of heart rending stories. I know of local people who have become unwell, some who have died who, for various reasons, didn't received the professional support that may have saved them. Friends and family are trying to help but without sufficient professional back up the strain can become unbearable.

The lack of an adequate mental health crises service is putting pressure on our Bream Bay Police team. Sergeant Simon Craig tells me that Police are more then ever being called in to deal with mental health crises situations and that these incidents take up many hours of their time.

Policemen and women are usually in that job because they want to look after people, and from, what I can gather, usually act with compassion when they are called on because no one from the mental health crises team in Whangarei is available. But Police don't receive training in this area and they have other important work to do.

The new Government has launched an inquiry into what in opposition it recognized as "a mental health crises". I hope this inquiry doesn't take too long.

We do need to look at the causes of mental illness and to find ways of steering people away from the abyss. I am interested in the work of Francil Tarua and the Whangarei based organization she heads called Supporting Families, Northland, which provides support and information to parents, partners, siblings, children and friends of people with mental illness.

Last year Francil held a series of Mental Health First Aid workshops at the Bream Bay Community Trust. Mental health problems are widespread and none of us are immune. According to the Mental Health Foundation figures one in six New Zealanders will experience some form of diagnosed mental illness in their lifetime.

Francil says, "If families have support and good quality information, they can make a real difference to recovery."

I am sure some of the answers lie here.

However, right now people are falling off cliffs and we need a few more ambulances. I think the government should be asking district health boards to beef up their crises teams. Why is the Whangarei team unable to respond when it is needed? Has it got enough funding and staff? Is the funding it does get well used? Do we urgently need more beds in the mental health facility at Whangarei Hospital?

It shouldn't take all year to work this out. There needs to be more urgency. People's lives are at stake.



Wet wipes blocking pipes cause sewerage spill in Waipu

Raw sewage spilled into the Waihoihoi River in Waipu late last month after a sewer pipe became blocked with wet wipes.

The blockage forced a manhole cover on a line to a house to pop open and as the house was unoccupied the problem wasn't noticed immediately.

Andy Keith, the Whangarei District Council's Wastewater and Stormwater Operations Manager, said council staff cleared the pipe at 5.30pm on Saturday 27 January after neighbours reported a bad smell. He estimates around three cubic metres of sewage got into the river, although as the section where the leakage occurred is covered in long grass it is likely this helped to filter the sewage.

Asked if there should be an alarm system to alert the Council of sewage leaks Mr. Keith replied that as there are over 500 kilometres of sewage pipes in the district and over 5,000 pipelines fitting each of these with monitors would be very expensive. "We get around \$300,000 a year to run the whole system so we just can't afford to do this."

Asked why there were no signs warning people about swimming at the Waipu boat club which is a popular cooling off spot for local children, Mr. would have been insignificant.

Warning signs did go up at Hamon Rd. and Johnson Point Rd. because shellfish are gathered from these spots. As shellfish are filter feeders a high degree of caution needs to be exercised in gathering and eating shellfish in sewage contaminated water.

Mr. Keith said wet wipes, which don't break down in water, are causing big problems in sewage systems throughout the district. They are often the cause of pump failures in the Ruakaka South area where each property has an individual pump.

He sais while most Ruakaka South home owners know about the pump system and are careful about what they flush down the toilet, problems often occur when new owners, tenants or short term holiday renters move in.

Council policy is to cover the cost of the first pump failure but property owners have to pay for subsequent failures.

Keith said a discussion was held with the District Health Board about this but it was decided that the river already has a high load of faecal matter coming off farmland at this time of the year and the difference the sewage spill would have made

Freedom campers - A burden on ratepayers for not much return

After much debate and revision the Whangarei District Council passed some Freedom Camping bylaws last autumn setting down a few rules about where freedom campers could park their vehicles.

Freedom camping has been a contentious issue, particularly at Ruakaka Beach Reserve alongside the surf lifesaving club. The new bylaw prohibits all camping from most of this reserve allowing self contained vehicles only to stay in two rows of marked parking spaces. Depending on

the size of the campervans this amounts to between six and eight spaces.

members of her family live.

However the woman left the house in the night to return to her son's home.

Her host's family members were out looking for her in the early hours of the morning and eventually found her making her way back to their house to retrieve her belongings.

By that time it was too late to get her onto the bus they had arranged for her.

They then took the woman to the Bream Bay Community Trust and later that morning she was spotted sitting alone at the bus stop at the Ruakaka roundabout.

It appears however that she didn't board the bus and is now living in Whangarei.

The woman's son has since made a payment towards the cost of the bus fair and has promised to pay the rest of the amount when he can afford to.

Asked why Police had left the woman sitting on the steps of the station, Senior Sergeant Simon Craig said, "Obviously, for privacy reasons Police cannot comment on a situation involving a specific person.

"However, you will be aware that incidents arising from mental health issues form a significant part of modern policing duties.

"It is not uncommon for people with mental health challenges to fall short of requiring compulsory treatment under the Mental Health Act, and to also not have committed any criminal offence which would empower Police to take affirmative action - such as arrest.

"In situations of that type Police have no right to detain a person, or to compel them to go anywhere they do not wish to.

"Although Police make every effort to keep all members of our community safe, sometimes individuals are not willing to accept assistance. Choosing to deal with their situations without Police involvement is their right - even if it sometimes appears ill-advised." Asked why the Bream Bay Community Support Trust

was unable to assist in this emergency situation, Ken Andrews, the Trust's Chairman said, "We cannot, for confidentiality issues, disclose details of the lady herself, nor her background, much of which if you knew, would provide quite the context and a real understanding of the path to the predicament she found herself in.

"However, I can comment in general regarding 'emergencies' as you described the incident below.

"The BBCST is not, nor has never been, an emergency service, nor an emergency crisis team. We have neither the contractual requirement, nor adequate resources to be a 24/7 service. And we join the long list of the majority of community services around the country that do not provide that constant service.

"However, there are a number of service providers who are 24/7, readily accessible, including through 0800 numbers or the emergency 111 number (and then typically through the Police who find themselves initially dealing with a very wide range of issues).

"In saying that, my dedicated BBCST team frequently is called upon out of hours, and during their days off and holidays, as if they are on call, which they are emphatically not. In my position I frequently remind the staff of that fact, and the need for them to have adequate rest away from their work – which is all part of professional staff management lead by Sue (Rudman)."

Craig Brown, who is a member of the Northland Health Board and a former police officer, said he thought it "strange" that the woman should have been left seated on the steps of the Police Station and in that situation she could have been taken into the Whangarei Hospital for assessment.

Having said that, he acknowledged that there isn't enough provision in small communities such as Ruakaka for people suffering mental health crises and he would be raising this issue at the next Northland Health Board meeting.

Rolls at three primary schools now almost even

The rolls of our three Bream Bay Primary schools were pretty even at the end of the first week of school 2018.

Waipu Primary had 228 enrolled children, One Tree Point Primary – 226 and Ruakaka Primary -227

This is a big turn around from 12 years ago when Ruakaka Primary with a roll of just 64 children, was the smallest of the schools by quite a margin. Ruakaka Primary is growing so fast that, at the directive of the Ministry of Education, the school's board has drawn up an enrolment zone defining the area where children need to live to attend the school as of right.

One Tree Point School already has an enrolment scheme in place and each year allocates a fixed number of available places for out of zone children. Preparations are under way for the building of two new classrooms and a new school hall at Ruakaka

Primary.

In comparison with 2017, Waipu Primary has three extra children, Ruakaka has 10 extra children and the roll at One Tree Point has dropped by 22. One Tree Point school secretary Val Klink said this is because there was a particularly large group of 48 year 6 children in 2017 who have now moved on to secondary school. She expected the roll to get back to last year's numbers as five-year-olds start school throughout the year.

Bream Bay College has had another big roll jump with 557 students enrolled at the end of the first week of term one. The roll was 514 at the start of 2017 and 450 at the beginning of 2016, so the school is in a steady growth mode.

In total the number of children and young people attending Bream Bay's four schools is now 1,238 compared to last year's total, which was 1,202.

Two striped marlin from different sides of the Pacific in a single week

Back home in Ruakaka on Friday 26 January, Gayle was feeling a bit jet lagged so decided to go our fishing with her husband Rod on their boat *Riff Raff* and she caught another marlin. This time the big fish had been hooked so they brought it home.

"We gave fish to about half of Ruakaka," Gayle said.

"Nothing went to waste."

Coastal Care members are concerned that the illegal boat ramp has been placed in the wild life refuge and that riparian planting along the riverbank to protect the reserve has been cleared.



King tides last week brought some high water but no flood damage (that we have heard about) to homes in low lying areas such as in Princes Rd., Ruakaka.

David Baylis, who lives in Princes Rd. said there was surface flooding at the southern end of the road where it dips and sea water backed up in drains which filled up with Sunday's heavy rainstorms but, thankfully, the wind was blowing in a nor - easterly rather then an easterly direction and, although there was some ponding on front lawns and in the park at the northern end of the road, "no one got wet".

Mr. Baylis is advocating the Whangarei District Council build a sea wall to protect the road. He says such a wall was proposed 38 years ago when the road was built. The wall would also protect the Princes St. Park, which is being well

used this summer.

He said the state of the park is a "disgrace."

"You don't see any parks up in Whangarei in that state." Simon Megchelse, of the Whangarei District Council's roading department, said he was unaware of any major roading damage in low-lying areas due to the extra high tides.

"Some of those roads do get normal surface flooding but they are in estuarine areas rather then on the open coast and they don't get the same erosion as areas that are subject to wave action."

Mr. Megchlese said there was a lot of discussion amongst Councillors and Council staff about building and retaining sea walls to protect coastal roads.

He said extreme high tides are "the new norm" so the Council needed to take this into account.



Freedom campers - A burden on ratepayers for not much return

We asked Mike Sharrock, manager of the Ruakaka Beach front motel, if the new laws had improved the situation from his perspective.

He said the bylaw had made some difference but the freedom campers were still causing problems for the motel. Some motel guests had complained that they had paid top rates for sea views and found themselves looking over a camping ground with people hanging out their washing to dry on the fence, brushing their teeth and spitting on the grass.

Mike said that he would not class the majority of the vans which parked on the reserve as self contained. "They have a sticker on the back but all they have is a bucket, which they don't use because there is no privacy here for them to do so."


He said he didn't blame the people who had hired the vans but rather the firms they had rented them from. Sometimes a rental van had a self-containment sticker but the rental company had charged a bond, which would be returned only if the toilet had not been used. Some of the campers came into the motel grounds to deposit their rubbish in the motel bins and almost every night he went out to tell campers setting up outside the designated camper parking that they risked being

moved in the night and a hefty fine if they stayed at that spot.

Mike said ratepayers are footing the bill for the freedom campers who contribute very little to the local economy. He had never seen any of the campers patronize the café nearby as they had their own cooking facilities. Sometimes these amounted to gas burners, which they set up on the grassed reserve besides their vans. Mike said during the dry weather when the grass was dry and brown these constituted a fire risk.

The Council paid the security company Armourguard made regular checks of the freedom camping area and council staff had extra work to do cleaning the public toilets and the reserve.

Also there remains the issue of freedom campers taking over a public reserve land. This is particularly a problem when there is an event such as a recent surf carnival at the beach and parking space is in short supply.

What is a Pharmaceutical Subsidy Card (PSC)?

A PSC is also known as a Safety Net Card, Prescription Subsidy Card, Exemption Card or Discount Card. It allows the cardholder and their family members to pay a lower amount on Government co-payment prescription charges. It is not income tested. Its purpose is to help people who face high prescription costs or have a large number of prescription items in a year.

How does the PSC work?

Any individual or family unit is entitled to a PSC once they have reached 20 subsidised prescription items in a 12 month period which runs between 1st February and 31st January every year.

The card does not cover herbal remedies, supplements not classified as medicines, or over the counter medicines (without needing a prescription), or on items where you do not pay a Government charge.

Who is entitled to a PSC?

A family unit can mean:

- One person with or without dependent children
- A married (or defacto) couple with no dependent children under 18 years
- A married (or defacto) couple with one or more dependent children under 18 years

Where and how can I get a PSC?

Your Life and Unichem Pharmacies can keep a prescription count for you and your family. Make sure the Pharmacist knows who is part of your family unit (e.g. If your partner or children have different surnames).

If you need to go to a different Pharmacy, bring in your receipts and show them to the Pharmacist so they can update your records. If you don't have a usual Pharmacy, be sure to keep all your receipts.

Once your family unit has reached a combined total of 20 subsidised prescription items, you will be issued with a PSC automatically if we hold all your up to date records.

Will I be charged for this service?

You will not be charged at a Life or Unichem Pharmacy.

What shall I do with the card?

Keep It in a safe place. The Pharmacy that gave it to you will have a record of the number, and all the members of your family that are entitled to use it.

If you or your family members need to go to a different Pharmacy then you will need to present the card along with your prescription.

Government prescription charges are made up of several different parts and can be very complicated. If you have any questions about the charges you pay, what medicines count towards your PSC, or which members of your family are entitled, then please ask one of our friendly Pharmacists to explain.

Bream Bay Swimmers take on Northland's Best By Julie Paton

The Douglas Logging Swimming Northland Age Group Championships is the biggest swimming event on Northland's calendar, and Bream Bay's 24 swimmers made their presence felt over the three-day event. They returned home with 38 gold medals, 37 silver, 38 bronze and 40 other minor placings. Paul Linton (17) was a standout performer – despite just recovering from injury, picked up seven medals and broke event records for his age group in 50m and 100m backstroke. Other swimmers who performed well were: Chelsea Rickey (10) with seven personal best times from her seven swims, and Abbey (13) and Casey McKegg (11) with 8 personal best times from 11 and 10 swims respectively. Lawrence Reade (12) swam ten best times from his 14 events, while Hunter Dobson (12) got nine from 13. Amy Swanson (12) put in an exceptional performance, with 10 personal best times from 10 swims. High medal counts went to Rebecca Reade (15) with 11, Hunter Dobson and Abby Wright (14) with ten; Luca Matenga (14), Ocean Shadbolt both won seven medals, and Amy Swanson, Kiera Carroll (13) and Rose Linton (17) five apiece. Jackson Somner-Allen won six gold medals from six events. Kieran Swords (19) emerged from semi-retirement to pick up two silver medals and deliver an excellent anchor-leg swim to win gold in the 14 years and over mixed relay with teammates Paul Linton, Rebecca Reade and Jackson Somner-Allen. The 10-11-year relay team (Charlotte Dutton, Casey McKegg, Ethan Carroll, Chelsea Rickey) came fourth, and the 12-13 year team of Kiera Carroll, Fidel Poulson, Hunter Dobson and Amy Swanson won bronze. The mixed age eight-member team in the championship's final event, the Crawford-Woodman relay, fought hard but could only manage third place behind Whangarei Swimming Club and a triumphant Bay of Islands team.





There is a Lambretta motor scooter parked on the deck at the entrance, a memory of the time the family lived in Vietnam when both Riki and Nina worked for Fonterra.

All four would ride on the bike, Nina seated behind, Riki on the front seat with Jade on his knee and Benji standing on the side

"It was too nice to leave behind," said Riki.

There are comfortable chairs and a couch in the espresso bar; it's a bit like a living room, with conversation and good coffee.

While, no doubt, a few tourists will hunt them out Nina and Riki say they are mostly here to look after the locals.

"If visitors find us that's fine, but our focus is the local community".

Nina and Riki are holding an open day at their cottage on Sunday 11 February from 12 noon to 2pm.


