What safeguards prevent virus arriving via our port?

After a marine engineer who worked on a ship that had arrived at Ports of Auckland from overseas, tested positive for Covid 19, Bream Bay people might want some assurance that Northport has some strict protocols in place to prevent the virus coming ashore here. Asked about what measures Northport is taking to prevent Covid 19 arriving in our community via the port, Peter Heath of the Due North PR company referred us to an item he had placed on the Northport website in anticipation of local concerns.

He gives assurances that, "We share community conviction that processes and procedures, in place to prevent transmission of COVID-19 through our vital marine trade and supply links, should be scrutinised and enforced rigorously.

"We continue to operate the port according to very clear and very strict procedures. These have served us well at all alert levels and we have no reason to believe that they will not continue to do so."


Mar. Heath said, port workers with any interaction with international ships and their crews are subject to mandatory testing as per Ministry of Health protocols. He said, "Very strict processes, quarantine requirements and health safeguards, including negative COVID tests, govern whether crew members can come ashore for any reason.

The Ministry of Health oversees crew transfers and Mr Heath said, incoming crew members are "treated as if they have the virus".

Footpath extension a collaborative community effort

The footpath alongside Waipu's Nova Scotia Estate subdivision has been extended another 28-metres with a collaborative community effort and a little bit of assistance from the Whangarei District Council.

A footpath built by the developmers along the Nova Scotia Rd. edge of the subdivision ended in front of the Waipu Fire Station and subdivision residents have had to navigate a hedge and a ditch while walking between their homes and the town.

John Troost, who co-ordinated the community effort, said a few years ago a person suffered a broken leg after falling and more recently a mobility scooter overturned with its driver ending up in the ditch shaken but unhurt. The residents had sent a petition to the Council to no avail until the offer from the community to take care of most of the arrangements themselves.

Agreement was reached with the Fire Service to build the footpath on its land and John pulled together a team with Gordon Walker on his digger preparing the path, Neil Troost using his tractor to pull out a strainer post that was in the way, Richie Guy setting up the boxing and John and Neil with Peter Couper and David Hopkins shaping the path, spreading and compacting the metal and doing a final tidy up after the concrete had been poured and the boxing removed.

"Most of us are oldies", said John. "Its been a lot of work pulling it all together but I am glad we got it done."

Mountfield Quarry supplied the base metal free of charge and Dion Webb of Complete Concrete Ltd. and his workers Paul Dey and Shaun Davis laid the concrete as a service to the Waipu community.

The Waipu Residents and Ratepayers Association contributed \$600 towards expenses and Waipu Real Estate provided morning teas for the volunteer workers. The concrete mix was paid for by the Whangarei District Council.

A section of the footpath between the fire station and the intersection of Nova Scotia Rd. and The Centre remains unpaved but John said the grass here is regularly mowed and the ground underfoot remains firm even in wet weather, so this does not present too much difficulty for pedestrians.




First, the ridge was not built by human activity at any time.

unique to Northport, and nor are the challenges involved. We work closely with other NZ ports to share information, learn lessons and enhance protections wherever necessary."

"We want to assure Northlanders that our entire team, and all the organisations who work on the Northport site, continue to do whatever we can to keep New Zealand safe. It's not a responsibility we take lightly."

A Ministry of Health spokesperson told the Bream Bay News, replacement crew that fly into New Zealand, join their vessel immediately if it is in port.

"The process is: they fly in, are collected by a vehicle driven by a driver in PPE gear and taken straight to the Port to board their vessel.

Crew that fly into NZ and have a few days before they can board are taken straight from the airport in organised transport with a driver in PPE gear to a managed isolation facility. They have no interaction with other guests or the community. Once it is time to board the vessel they are driven directly to the Port.

The MoH spokesperson said, if port workers are required to be on or near international vessels "there are good measures and advice in place for these workers to follow including keeping necessary time on the vessel to a minimum, practicing good hygiene, social distancing and the use of PPE" and that regular mandatory fortnightly testing of higher-risk port workers is in place.

The spokesperson said, "The Ministry of Health regularly reviews the COVID-19 strategy to ensure that it remains fit for purpose for our elimination strategy – we are reviewing what the testing programme for port workers and crew members wishing to enter New Zealand looks like, and how such testing might occur in a way that maximises safety."

Last Friday the Minister of Health Chris Hipkins announced that starting this week there would be mandatory testing for all replacement maritime crew arriving in New Zealand.



Submissions open on Camping in Public Places bylaw

People have until Friday 27 November to make submissions on some proposed amendments to the Whangarei District Council Review of its Camping in Public Places bylaw.

Under the proposed changes to the bylaw, the Council will give itself the option of temporarily closing freedom camping areas to protect health and safety. It will also make it clear that camping is temporary in its nature and there are limits on the number of nights freedom campers can spend at designated freedom camping spots.

There are also some site-specific changes. Those affecting Bream Bay locations are:

- The road verge at One Tree Point road layby will be specifically prohibited to campers for health and safety reasons: campers are at risk of falling over the cliff.
- At Ruakaka Beach Reserve campers will no longer be permitted on the landward side of the road as the ground is too soft and a number of campervans have got into trouble there. They will still be allowed to camp on the seaward side.
- At the Ruakaka Riverside Reserve the space allowed for camping will be reduced to accommodate just three or four vehicles.
- At Marsden Bay Reserve Vehicles now prohibited on northern end of the reserves, which was the area

subject to most complaints.

- At the One Tree Point boat ramp carpark several more camping spaces will be created. Campers will be permitted to stay for one night only and no tents will be allowed.
- At the Waipu Caves, a popular freedom camping spot, things will remain much as they are except bollards will be installed to protect campers from driving on the grass.

All this is necessary due to the Freedom Camping Bylaw passed in 2011, which makes it mandatory for Councils to allow freedom camping on Council owned public reserves unless there are specific reasons why this is not possible.

Child killed when car collides with truck trailer

A nine-year-old girl was killed when the car she was travelling in collided with a truck trailer on State Highway 1 at Mata at around 7.30pm on Friday 30 October. The trailer had come lose from the truck towing it.

Extra Police brought in to help with Takahiwai fight event

Police from around Northland were called in to help keep the peace in Takahiwai on Saturday 17 July when representatives of a large number of patched gangs gathered for a fight competition held in a marquee on the property of Headhunters gang member Herbie Rata. The event was held without incident.

Crash driver breath tests over legal alcohol limit

At 11pm on 22 October a driver lost control of the vehicle he was driving and crashed into a paddock on Marsden Point Rd. The driver underwent a breath alcohol test and returned a result of 636 micrograms of alcohol per litre of breath. The legal limit is 250 micrograms. A 27-year-old Ruakaka man will be appearing in the Whangarei District Court later this month on a drink driving charge.

Motorbike impounded

A motorcyclist fled from Police after being caught speeding at 6pm on 23 October. The 25-year-old Whangarei man was apprehended in Salle Rd. and arrested and charged with failing to stop when asked to by Police, excessive speed and driving while disqualified. His motorbike was impounded.

School bus involved in crash at SH1/SH12 intersection

A Leabourn bus carrying students to Otamatea High School collided with a truck and a car at the intersection of SH1 and Highway 12 at around 8.20am on Friday morning 30 October. All three vehicles were travelling at relatively slow speeds five people were taken to Whangarei Hospital with minor to moderate injuries. Police as well as the Leabourn company are carrying out separate investigations into the cause of the accident.

Burglary foiled by tight security

Burglars left empty handed after attempting to break into a commercial premises on Pyle Rd East on Friday 30 October. The property owner has a good security system in place.



Robyn Anderson's stunning Prescott Rd. garden - one of 14 featured in the Marsden Bay Garden Club ramble

Robyn Anderson's Prescott Road garden is one of 14 that will feature in the Marsden Bay Garden Clubs Garden Ramble on Saturday 7 November.

Robyn and her partner Greg moved here seven years ago. Greg, who is a keen trout fisherman had always liked the area and Robyn said she would only move if they found a property as good as the one they had in Onerahi, which had a great view. The Prescott Road garden sits above the Wilsons Dam and has a wide view of the water.

The driveway into the property is pretty steep; so don't wear your high heels. It is spectacular with flowering vireya on one side and on the left a fringe of mauve lantana with roses blooming behind.

Vireya, a form of rhododendron suited to warmer climates, is one of Robyn's favourite plants. She likes their tropical appearance and teams them up with ferns. She selects plants that have lovely foliage as well as lovely flowers.

The lantana is montevidensis, a trailing form that doesn't stray into the bush. It is an example of Robyn's use of mass plantings for effect. On warm days the flowers give off a sweet fragrance, quite different to the smell of lantana leaves, which can be quite strong, and flocks of monarch butterflies come and feast on the nectar.

Scented flowers are another aspect of the garden. Particularly on warm days, the scents of frangipani, honeysuckle, orchids, daphne and flowering cabbage trees are carried on the breeze. The garden borders the Whangarei District Council's catchment for the dam and at its margins Robyn concentrates on

planting native species. She has a number of rare plants – Three Kings kawakawa, The Three Kings kaikomako which is the offspring of a single tree found growing on Great Island in the Three Kings group off Cape Reinga by botanist Geoff Baylis of the University of Otago in 1945. Another to look out for is a clumping kanuka plant named Little Fox after our very own Ian Fox, former owner/operator of Alternatives nursery. When Greg's mother died Robyn inherited her shade house and collection of orchids. Many remain under shelter but some, including a spectacular zygopetalum have been planted along the garden walks or in the forks of trees.

The orchard and vege garden is set amongst flowers and Robyn describes this section of the garden as a "cultivated wilderness." She said it is a memory garden for her late sister whose garden was like this.

A family of Arapawa sheep keep the lawns mown and clear of weeds. They have tiny feet, which don't tend to pug the ground. These were inherited when they purchased the property.

Living alongside so much bush, trapping for possums, stoats, rats and weasels is a necessity. Robyn knows when the rat population is building up as the fantails all disappear. She recalls watching a stoat going from tree to tree taking fledglings from nests while the parent birds screeched in alarm before Greg managed to shoot it, in a tree below the house.

A recent development is a big rock garden in the front of the deck facing the dam. There is also a pond under construction at the bottom end of the garden. Greg worried about opening up to the public while the garden is not complete but Robyn says, "When is a garden ever finished? It is always a work in progress."

There are shade houses where Robyn propagates many of the plants she uses. What she doesn't need she sells on Trade Me to help finance the project and she will have plants available for sale at the garden ramble.

Devonshire teas will also be on sale at this garden, with proceeds going towards the Ruakaka Recreation Centre fire safety upgrade.

The award is for pork sausages. Alongside beef sausages, pork is the category that attracts the most entries so the Golden Fork for this section is very prestigious.




The concert is a fundraisier for the Northcal band whose premises in Whangarei suffered were flooded in the July storm with damage to some of the groups piping and drumming equipment.






